# Overview

This document sets out who partners are and where we work with them.

## About Centre

We are an independent non-profit foundation and cross-party think tank. Our mission is to rebuild the centre ground and to create a more centrist and moderate politics. We support better public services and a strong economy inspired by policies from the Nordic countries.

To achieve these goals, we work with people from across the UK and party politics. This includes engaging with politicians and our networks, which include academia, politics, and law.

Our work includes creating new conversations by hosting events and conducting interviews. We also produce new policy ideas to better inform debate, publish papers, and release articles. We aim to build consensus, shape public opinion, and work with policymakers to change policy.

## Membership criteria

Our partnership network is open to non profit organisations, charities, pressure groups, campaign groups, think tanks, organisations within political parties and coalition groups. Partnerships include organisations we have officially agreed a partnership with, organisations we have joined as a member, coalition member or partner.

## Benefits of joining the network

Our partnerships are used to show that we are working with an organisation or that we share particular common goals. There are no specific commitments as a partner unless stated in an individual agreement with that organisation.

1. A dedicated post on our social media pages to announce you have joined the network, including a graphic.
2. A profile on our network, including your logo, a biography, and links to your social media pages. This shows the public who we are working with, which helps us to be transparent about our work and to draw attention to the work of other organisations where we share goals.
3. The opportunity to sign up for our newsletter highlighting opportunities to be involved in our work. These include opportunities to appear on our podcast, to speak at our events as a panellist, to contribute to papers including forewords, to contribute to case studies within papers, write articles, and to get involved with our campaigns.
4. Invites to attend all of our events, and where relevant, be invited to speak at them as well as on our podcast.

5. Our network allows you to connect with the other organisations and politicians we work with.

6. Flexible membership where members can do as much or as little as they would like to fit around your time commitments. We are happy for network members to join simply to show their support for us.

7. Members retain their independence. We state on our website that our network members are independent and do not necessarily support every Centre policy.

## Membership terms

- Applications to join the network must be voted on by our team. All votes on our team are one member, one vote, and are passed by a simple majority.
- You may leave at any time by informing a Centre Director, and your information will be removed from our website.
- If our team decides to remove a member from the board, this will also be conducted through a vote.
