Introduction

Centre Aberystwyth was a campaigning society that focused on finding solutions to issues that impact students. We then worked with other societies to change the policies of the Student Union, the university and the local council. We also ran events with guest speakers and socials. It was our first-ever student society and was created in 2021.

Chapter one

Stopping spiking and supporting survivors coalition



Just after the pandemic, we saw cases of spiking rise both nationally and within Aberystwyth. To tackle the issue we created a coalition of 19 university societies and submitted a motion to the Aberystwyth Student Union. This had over 300 supporting signatures and our coalition website page received over 100 visits.

The full motion

The motion said: "We note that there has been a substantial increase in spiking cases in Aberystwyth, with many of our students having experienced it. This has been confirmed by both the University and the police. Due to the dangers of spiking, and the number of incidents that have occurred, we believe that it is important that we take any measures we can to both avoid such incidents and support those who fall victim to such incidents.

The first section of this idea is around avoidance, with the Student's Union (SU) buying test strips that can detect common ingredients that are used to spike drinks. This will enable students to test their drinks on a night out if they are worried- meaning that they can stay safer and potentially reduce the chances of them consuming a spiked product. Additionally, test strips also provide a quick way to determine whether a drink was spiked if a person thinks they may have been, which will enable a person who's been spiked to seek medical help immediately and earlier on. Whilst these strips will not pick up every potential substance that could be used to spike someone, they at least increase the protection level that students have on a night out.

To ensure that students can access these products, they should be available at the SU for collection- with them also being advertised on the SU website, by email and digital channels. Moreover, these could be funded through grants from external organisations like the police or other alcohol awareness and sexual assault charities. If a funding source cannot be found, the meantime should be spent working with local bars, pubs, and clubs to try and get them to stock the strips. This will ensure that students are still safe no matter where they go out in town.

The second section of this idea is to ensure that when in town students are safe and can easily get help. A major part of this is making sure that students are aware of where to go if a spiking incident occurs. Therefore, the SU should also contact local bars, pubs and clubs and publish details of where to go and what to do in each of these venues on their website. This will make sure that students have somewhere that can easily reference if anything occurs, and that they are also able to read these before a night out so that they know what to do if something does happen. Moreover, the SU could also work with different venues and share good practices, with these hopefully improving the level of safety across Aberystwyth as a whole.

The last section of this idea concerns the support that victims of spiking receive. Under current academic procedures, in some departments, students who are victims of spiking may be penalised academically if they miss a class due to the incident. This is due to attendance being a contributing factor in some modules towards the total module grade. Therefore, we believe that the SU should work with the University to change these procedures and ensure that students are not ever given an unauthorised absence if they are spiked. This should be the case even without any proof, such as a police report, with this policy recognising that not all victims of spiking feel comfortable reporting an incident to the police or even anybody at all".

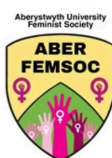

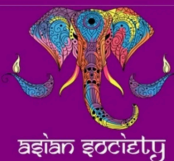

Chapter two

Supporting students



Supporting students

When the cost of living crisis hit some of those worst affected were students. Our aim at this time was to support policies which would make life better for students and to support them through the crisis.

Our policies were:

Better access to food banks for students, allowing lecturers or SU staff to refer them if needed.

This is a measure that will help students who are living in town, as now they are often unable to access them as they do not meet the criteria. The Students' Union should work with local organisations to ensure that this is changed so that students are able to access these services if needed.

A rent freeze on university accommodation.

Currently, our university accommodation takes up more than some students receive in their student loans. This is a problem as it means that students are already in deficit before they even start the year. Putting a rent freeze on university accommodation will ensure that next year, students are not struggling with accommodation payments as other prices increase.

Transparency on costs of accommodation, the prices of electricity, water, upkeep etc. Students need to know that they are getting a good deal.

As University accommodation rates are so large, we ask that the University publish their costs of running accommodation online. This will help students know that they are getting a fair deal and that the University is not making a profit at their expense.

Making University more accessible:

More disabled-friendly accommodation, with it being reasonably priced.

During the crisis, disabled students should not have their inequality further exacerbated. We have heard stories from disabled people who have had to take accommodation in higher tiers (hence also paying higher rates) solely because they are disabled, and their needs could not be met in cheaper alternatives. Nobody should be punished for having a disability, so we ask that the University either works to create more accessible accommodation or pay the difference in accommodation rates.

Mandatory lecture recordings and an end to penalising lower attendance.

Now, students are under intense pressure to make ends meet, which often means working. This means that they may end up needing to miss University to work. Students should not be punished for this and should receive the resources from the session if they are not present.

Working with the local council to secure a grant to help students with the crisis.

One solution that we would ask to be implemented is a one-off cost of living payment, which other Universities like York have done. Although their criteria were fairly strict, with it only supporting those who are in a student private house, it is something that we could model off here and provide to a wider number of students. This would give students more financial security.

Transparency on the hardship fund and how it is calculated.

Transparency around the hardship fund would ensure students know more about how much money they can receive. It would also allow societies and other groups to propose changes to the hardship fund.

No evidence is needed for extensions or special circumstances.

This was implemented during the pandemic and would reflect the exceptional stress that students are under as they try to make costs meet.

Supporting students coalition

To put pressure on the local council and the university we created a coalition of 12 university societies who agreed with our policy solutions. During this time our page on the issue and policy booklet received over 100 views.
